The above fees are a quote and can be varied depending on the complexity of the matter & the F/E handling matter *The fees above do not include disbursements & some fees may not attract VAT if you are exempt & this may be applied in some immigration cases.

** Where it is stated that VAT will be charged it will be charged at 20%.

Disbursements (not included in costs set out above):

Disbursements are costs related to your matter that are payable to third parties. We will handle the payment of the disbursements on your behalf to ensure a smoother process. Disbursements include:

- a. Interpreters fees from £25-£50 per hour. Most kinds of application will normally require between 3 -10 hours of client contact with an interpreter, depending on the complexity of your case.
- b. Court Fees. We will let you know the amount if a court fee is payable.
- c. Independent expert reports e.g. medical experts. These are not required in many cases: we will let you know as soon as possible if we consider an expert report is necessary.
- d. If there is an interview and we do attend with you, there will be additional disbursements in respect of our mileage/travel expenses.

The costs quoted here do not include:

- a. Any Home Office fees for making the application. You will pay this to the Home Office directly as part of the application process.
- b. Where the Home Office refuse your application, advice and assistance in relation to any appeal.

What are the key stages of the immigration service provided?

1. Taking initial instructions and advising on the appropriate application including
2. Review your supporting documents and advise on the merits of your case
3. Submit your online application within 3 weeks of receiving and reviewing your documents.
4. Receiving a decision from the Home Office on your decision and advising on the same.

How long will my application take?

We cannot guarantee how long the Home Office will take to process your application. Read the current Home Office Processing times here:

We will normally be able to submit this type of application within 1-3 weeks of you instructing us depending on the availability of the required documents, but we will let you know at the earliest opportunity if it is likely to take longer than this. If your case is urgent with a deadline for submission within 1 week we will discuss with you the practicalities of meeting the deadline and if we are able to do so agree an appropriate plan of action.

Advice and representation at the First-tier Tribunal (Immigration and Asylum Chamber) in relation to appeals against Home Office visa or immigration decisions (excluding asylum).

The time taken to prepare an appeal varies considerably depending on the issues of the appeal.

The time required is likely to be in the range of 20-40 hours preparation time.

For the appeal hearing itself it is our usual practice to instruct high quality barristers to represent you.

We work closely with the barrister and in most appeals will arrange a meeting with you and the barrister prior to the hearing (known as a “conference”). We will discuss with you the options and offer you a range of experience and price. Costs for the barrister are likely to be in the range of £1,000-£5,000 plus VAT (20%) depending on the seniority of the barrister and the complexities of the case.
